New Delhi, the 16th June 1964

S.O. 2180.—The following Order made by the President on June 14, 1964, is published for general information:—

ORDER

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (3) of article 77 of the Constitution, the President hereby makes, with effect from June 9, 1964, the following amendments in the Government of India (Allocation of Business) Rules, 1961, namely:—

In the said Rules—

- (A) for the First Schedule, the Schedule as specified in Appendix I to this Order shall be substituted;
- (B) in the Second Schedule—
 - (a) before the heading "Ministry of Community Development and Co-operation", two headings and the entries under those headings as specified in Appendix II to this Order shall be inserted;
 - (b) under the heading "Ministry of Education", entries 7, 8, 10, 11, 12 and 16 shall be omitted;
 - (c) under the heading "Ministry of Health", entries 7 and 57 shall be omitted;
 - (d) under the heading "Ministry of Home Affairs", entries 19, 20, 21, 22, 94 and 95 shall be omitted;
 - (e) for the heading "Ministry of Industry" and the entries under that heading, the heading and the three sub-headings and the entries under those sub-headings as specified in Appendix III to this Order shall be substituted;
 - (f) the heading "Ministry of International Trade" and the entries shown under that heading shall be omitted;
 - (g) under the heading "Ministry of Labour & Employment" entries 6 and 26 shall be omitted;

- (h) for the heading "Ministry of Steel, Mines and Heavy Engineering" and the sub-headings and the entries under those sub-headings, the heading, sub-headings and the entries as specified in Appendix IV to this Order shall be substituted;
- (i) under the heading "Ministry of Transport", entries 25 to 34 shall be omitted;
- (j) after the heading "Department of Communications" and the entries under that heading, the following heading and entries shall be inserted, namely:—
 "Department of Social Security" and the entries specified in Appendix V to this Order;
- (k) the heading "Department of Supply" and the entries under that heading shall be omitted; and
- (l) the heading "Department of Technical Development" and the entry under that heading shall be omitted.
