New Delhi, the 6th February 1965

S.O. 466.—The following Order made by the President on February 5, 1965, is published for general information:—

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (3) of article 77 of the Constitution, the President hereby makes, the following amendments in the Government of India (Allocation of Business) Rules, 1961, namely:—

In the said Rules—

(A) in the First Schedule, for entry 11, the following entry shall be substituted, namely:—

“Ministry of Industry and Supply:—

(i) Department of Industry;

(ii) Department of Supply and Technical Development;”;

(B) in the Second Schedule, under the heading, “Ministry of Industry and Supply”,

(i) for sub-heading “A. Department of Heavy Engineering” and the entries thereunder, and for sub-heading “B. Department of Industry” and the entries thereunder, the sub-heading and entries as given in Appendix ‘I’ to this Order shall be substituted.

(ii) for the existing sub-heading “C. Department of Supply and Technical Development”, the following sub-heading shall be substituted, namely:—

“B. Department of Supply and Technical Development”.
