- to facilitate finalization of a factual report on the accomplishments of the Central Ministries, Agencies and PSUs involved in implementation of prioritized schemes/projects for evaluation by Prime Minister;
- xii) to consider issues relating to disinvestment;
- xiii) to decide price band for the sale of Government shares through GDR/domestic capital market route prior to the book building exercise, to decide the final price of sale in all cases;

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- il) Developing strategies for development that combine the objectives of environmental conservation and economic development of tribal communities.
- iii) Re-orienting the strategy of Tribal Sub Plans to ensure that the historical backlog of tribal people in sectors like education, health, irrigation, electricity, road connectivity, drinking water supply and other basic needs are ensured and developing a Tribal Development Index to monitor this. Measurable targets of crucial indicators should be fixed for tribal areas.
- iv) Consider converting the current Policy of Rehabilitation into a law as far as tribal areas are concerned so that large scale displacement from their habitat is avoided and rehabilitation is effectively ensured.
- V) Creating powers for the Ministry of Tribal Affairs to intervene on matters that vitally impinge on tribal rights to resources guaranteed under existing laws like PESA by restricting other Ministries from unilateral action that may infringe on tribal rights, which would require the concurrence of the Ministry of Tribal Affairs;
- vi) Ensuring conditionalities through Centrally Sponsored Programmes that posts in tribal areas in areas like education and health are filled up;
- vii) Monitoring of implementation of PESA by the Ministry of Tribal Affairs;
- viii) Ensuring that possibilities of value addition of NTFP are exploited in favour of tribal population through appropriate policy and programmes.
